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## Canadian Cyclocross Championships

**Location:** Lévis, Quebec

**Project Dates:** November 14-18, 2024

- Arrive Quebec City Thursday, November 14, Depart Quebec City Monday, November 18

**Race Dates:** Nov. 16-17, 2024

### **Team Size**

The desired team size will be 4 female and 4 male athletes. The ABA reserves the right to vary the team size of the project based on interest level, athlete performance level and logistical considerations.

### **Selection Date**

Notification of selection to the team will be made the week of Oct. 22, 2023.

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for selection to the team athletes must:

- Possess a current ABA license.
- Be born between 2007 and 2010 inclusive (ages 15-18 in 2025).
- Fill in the expression of interest found below before Oct. 1.

### **Selection Criteria**

Athletes will be selected to the team objectively by points (ABA Cup Open Category), (race performance (Provincial Championships and Western Challenge) and subjectively by committee selection.

### **Selection by Points**

Points will be earned at all ABA Cup Cyclocross races up until Oct. 22, 2024. Points will be awarded in the Open Women and Open Men categories (as indicated in Table 1 on the next page (Note that any rider can race Open and does not require a temporary license from the Race Committee to do so). Ties will be broken by the result at the Western Challenge.

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Selection will be made in the following

### Men and Women

- Priority 1: 1<sup>st</sup> on Points (ABA Cup Open Category)
- Priority 2: Provincial Champions (JM, JW, U17M, U17W)
- Priority 3: Western Challenge Champions (JM, JW, U17M, U17W)
- Priority 4: Committee selection
